Foundation Presents Legend Award to Justice Steven David

(INDIANAPOLIS) – Retiring Indiana Supreme Court Justice Steven David is the inaugural recipient of the Indiana Bar Foundation's Legend Award. Justice David received the recognition during the Foundation's annual awards luncheon Friday during the Foundation's Annual Meeting and Awards Luncheon.

Justice David will retire later this year after taking the oath of office as Indiana's 106th Supreme Court Justice in October 2010 after being appointed by Governor Mitch Daniels. Voters retained him in 2012. Justice David served our nation's military for 28 years and was a trial court judge in Boone County for 15 years. Justice David is a member of many legal and civic organizations, including the Indiana Judges Association, the state and national Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges, the American Inns of Court, and the American Bar Foundation. He is a member of the American, Indiana, Indianapolis, and Boone County Bar Associations, the Military Officers Association of America, the Zionsville American Legion, the Lebanon Elks Club, and the Lebanon Kiwanis Club. He currently serves as President of the Community Foundation of Boone County and has previously served on the Zionsville and Lebanon Boys and Girls Clubs' Board of Directors. Justice David has been an active Foundation supporter and has been a visible part of the Indiana High School Mock Trial competition.

Scott Wylie, Executive Director of the Volunteer Lawyer Program of Southwestern Indiana, and Executive Director of Indiana's pro bono civil legal aid organization received the Indiana Bar Foundation's Champion Award of Civil Legal Assistance. Wylie is a staunch advocate for low-income Hoosiers living in Southwestern Indiana needing legal assistance. He just completed his term as President of the National Association of Pro Bono Professionals. For more than 20 years, Wylie has trained new pro bono leaders annually at the ABA's Equal Justice Conference. Throughout his career, Wylie has mentored scores of Hoosier attorneys, law students, and paralegals while an active member of the Foundation Board of Directors.

Educator Janet Chandler received the Indiana Bar Foundation Champion Award of Civic Education. Chandler teaches a wide variety of classes at Hamilton Southeastern High School, and next year will teach her 26th different course. In addition to We the People, she coaches Mock Trial, sponsors the Rho Kappa National Social Studies Honor Society, and serves as the school's Law & Government Academy Director.

She spent the last six years as a board member of the Indiana Bar Foundation, where most recently, she was the co-chair of the Civic Education committee. Chandler has been named a Sagamore of the Wabash, her district's Teacher of the Year, and last year was named the ISTA Hoosier Educator of the Year. Chandler recently earned a Teaching Excellence award from the NEA Foundation.
